Making Inferences

Eliminate answers that specify direct information: inferences are not specific!

Evidence

supports

opinion!

can change

objective

subjective

straight from facts

also helps me make/support an **INFERENCE**!

Look for direct evidence from the text in answer choices.

EVIDENCE

(from the text)

- auroras look like   or  ribbons of light
- only appear in (N) & (S) poles.
- Northern Lights Southern Lights visible at times.
- auroras occur on other planets w/ magnetic poles.
